Southampton County - In the clerk's office the 2nd February 1825 This Indenture was made by the sale of Simon Morley Frederick Collett and Thompson Collett the wife of Thoms and together with a certificate thereon endorsed certifying the action in judgment of the examination of Martha Green wife of the said James Green parties thereto and admitted to read and at a term held for the above said County of Southampton on the 25th March 1825 This Indenture and Certificate as aforesaid were entered upon the record and of Reading James Rockwell Clerk

Where Indenture made and executed this 28th day of February in the year of our Lord 1825 Between James Scaggins and Wmty his wife of the one part and Frederick Collett of the other part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia testifying that the said James Scaggins and Wmty his wife for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and twenty one dollars and thirty cents to them in hand paid to be paid by the said Frederick Collett the receipt whereof they the said James Scaggins and wife do hereby acknowledge have granted bargained and sold and do by these presents do give grant bargain sell convey make over and confirm unto the said Frederick Collett his heirs and assigns forever ten or more parcels of land lying and being in the County of Southampton and containing fifty acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a black gum tree on the side of the road & corner in Stone River land running thence 87° 40' 00" pole to the first corner then 200th pole thence 141° 45' 00" pole to a pine a new corner made in Stone River line thence 141° 45' 00" pole to a small tree that goes through Stone River thence 141° 45' 00" pole to a large pine a new corner made in Stone River thence 141° 45' 00" pole to the first station & being the same tract or parcel of land which Scaggins Collett the said Scaggins and wife had and which was sold by her on credit. It has been and to her the aforesaid each one parcel of land together with all of its improvements and appurtenances unto her the said Frederick Collett his heirs and assigns forever to his and their own proper use benefit and behoof forever and the said James Scaggins for satisfying his creditors and advancing himself and his heirs and assigns grant to and with the said Frederick Collett his heirs and assigns that he will warrant and defend the above said tract or parcel of land unto him the said Frederick Collett his heirs and assigns forever against all
