This Indenture made and entered into the 20<sup>th</sup> day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty five between Frederick Collett surviving of one heath side of the County of Southampton of the one part and James Scaggins of the County of Dorset of the other part Witness that whereas the said James Scaggins the last first and last named which has been duly recorded with the Court of the County aforesaid among other things therein expressed enforced and directed that his lands should be sold for purposes expressed in the said will by his executors whom he constituted and appointed of whom the above named Frederick Collett is one who presents the will of the said James Scaggins for part of which was granted him in due form of law and therefore to do a purchase of the trustees of the executors thereof and whereas in discharge of duty as executors aforesaid he has caused to be advertised and sold the tract of land in the aforesaid will expressed to the highest bidder at which time and place the aforesaid James Scaggins became the highest bidder consequently the purchase of the said land at the price of one hundred and fifty one dollars and thirty cents the receipt of which the said Frederick Collett as aforesaid did hereby acknowledge and do therefore give bargain sell and convey unto the said James Scaggins the aforesaid tract of land of which Frederick Collett the said purchase and which is directed in his last will and testament to be sold containing by estimation fifty acres more or less and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a point from the side of the road a corner in James Potts land surveying thence 1/2 to 20 poles to the spot called the corner gut thence S 45° W 1/2 pole to a new corner made in James Potts land then along near a creek run that goes through the said Potts corner thence S 1/2 E 1/2 pole to a large pond a new corner made in James Potts land then along and a branch thence N 1/2 E 1/2 pole to a new point a new corner made in James Potts land thence 20 to 20 poles to the road aforesaid and from thence N 45° W 1/2 pole to the front street &c having to do with the aforesaid tract of land with its appurtenances and all other advantages thereunto belonging unto him the said James Scaggins and his heirs and the said Frederick Collett the said Frederick Collett as aforesaid for and in satisfaction of the circumstances aforesaid as well for the further consideration of the aforesaid and sum of one thousand and forty one dollars and thirty cents the said sum or half paid or seemed to be paid to him as aforesaid expressed hath and do by these presents give bargain sell make over Transfer and convey unto the said James Scaggins the aforesaid tract of land in etc. all of its appurtenances and appurtenances as to him and his heirs forever and the said Frederick Collett do hereby warrant and defend the right and title thereof to him the said James Scaggins and his heirs forever against him the said Frederick Collett or any other person or persons claiming by through or under him.
