John and wife and doth in writing the said 118 thousand dollars and by these presents do give and sell  
Solemnly by and being in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia and, bounded and  
governed by Beginning at a red oak tree on Joseph Gilman house line 100 feet east along the said  
line road to a hickory tree 5 1/2 rods south a pine tree 100 feet west along the said  
line 100 feet to a postmark stone 5 1/2 rods to a postmark stone 100 feet to an  
elk oak stone 100 feet to Joseph Gilman house corner postmark stones along Joseph Gilman  
line to the aforesaid William Wrights line thence along the aforesaid William Wrights line  
to Joe Longys house line to James Wrights line thence along  
James Wrights line up and across the South an open road to Wrights line again thence along  
Wrights line to the house of Mr. Gilman's son and thence to the beginning Containing by  
late survey Two hundred and twenty two acres be the same more or less by reason of all and  
singular the encroachments heretofore made and improvements thereon belonging or may here  
after come to be made or to be had or held by the said tract or parcel of land with all and singular the prop  
erty and appurtenances unto the said William Wright his heirs and assigns forever to the  
only payment and benefit and loss of him the said William Wright his heirs and assigns  
forever. And the said William Longy and Martha his wife do further declare their hands and  
affix the date to the said tract of land and every part and parcel thereof against the claim  
of themselves and all persons claiming by them or under them or either of them as well  
against the claim and demand of all and every person and persons whatsoever claiming
