 consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars good and lawful money of Virginia to them in hand paid
 by the said John Lewis at or before the execution of these presents the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge
 themselves fully and amply satisfied contented and paid and therefore request the said John Lewis to have and
 assign forever with grant bargain and sell all claims and demands and by these presents full grant
 assign and confirm unto the said John Lewis his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land
 and premises with the appurtenances near in the town and occupation of the said John Lewis said
 lying and being in the aforesaid parish and County on the south side of the road here beginning
 at a spring on the long bridge corner for them shown said branch to some hill towards the
 said road to a piece a corner John Lewis and Benjamin Do not show a line of markers from
 near the farm branch to a spring at the road a corner of R. P. Do not show a line of markers from
 road to a piece a corner of John Edward then shown the said Edward Lewis to the
 first station and all houses out houses outhouses buildings yards lands and other things
 come to profits here attached and appurtenances to the said land belonging or in any way appur-
 taining to the said right title interest use trust profit power property claim or demand whatsoever of them the said
 John Lewis and Charles the wife of the said John Lewis and every part thereof Do have and to have the
 plantation tract or parcel of land unto the said John Lewis his heirs and assigns forever and the said
 John Lewis and Charles his wife for themselves their heirs executors and assigns as at length expressed premises of
 grants and seek the said John Lewis his heirs and assigns by these presents shall and well defend and
 forever defend against the title claim and demand of any other person or persons claiming or demanding the
 same or any part or parcel thereof by their presents Do not show or hereof the said John Lewis and Charles

This Indenture made and entered into this 3 day of April 1825 in the year of our Lord about 1825 in and between James Ryley
 of the County of Southampton Virginia of the first part and Matthew Gardner of the second part and Mered G. Gardner of the third
 part and shall of the third part witness that the said Matthew Gardner and the said James Ryley had sold
 a certain tract or parcel of land for the sum of eighty dollars and made payable the 31 day of December next and assigned
 from the execution of the indenture was executed on the date of these presents which note was given the said Ryley as
 principal and the said Gardner as security For the said Ryley being desirous to indemnify and secure the said
 Gardner in this his business he did make voluntarily for the sum of four dollars to him the said James Ryley on the
 part of him the said Mered Gardner before the execution and delivery of these presents to the said James
 Ryley had granted bargain and sell and do by these presents give grant bargain and sell to him the said
 Mered G. Gardner his heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit one Bay mare which the said
 the said Ryley purchased of Simon Musgrave on the 11th instant which horse had of sheep three head of cattle two
 feather beds and furnished on cart and wheels three from wheels four iron pots and one frying pan fifteen
 or six barrels and all my plantations woods and single head of negro stock and all my debts and all of
 Matthew Gardner to have and to hold unto the above mentioned property for him the said James Ryley or assigns
 the said James Ryley his heirs and assigns and every person whatsoever to have the said Mered G. Gardner
 the horse and assigns forever upon their following bond by that of the said Ryley then hereon approp-
 riated to pay and discharge the debt due the said James Musgrave with all costs pertaining to the
 bond or on before the 31 day of December next a that bond it shall be lawful and lawful for
 the said Mered G. Gardner as soon as requested in writing from and on the hand of him the
 said Matthew Gardner his heirs or assigns to do and sell for cash the above mentioned prop-
 erty at some place appointed by him and made known at least ten days before the day of
