This Indenture made this 15th day of January in the year of our Lord 1525 between Roderick Achebe of the first and Augustino Lope of the second parts and Lope of the third part all of the County of Santa Fe and State of Virginia testified that whereas the said Augustino Lope hath become security for the said Roderick Achebe in a debt due by him to the said Lope that he the said Augustino Lope should defend the said Roderick Achebe with their presents also another debt due to the said Augustino Lope by bond on the sum of twenty one dollars bearing even date with their presents And this indenture further testifieth that the said Roderick Achebe having being and desiring of securing the said Augustino Lope on the said bond of ship and sum of the bargain and sale of and by their presents both given bargain and sale unto the said Roderick Achebe and to his heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit the feather bed and Sumptuous on his side and four head of Cows To the said Roderick Lope and to his heirs and assigns forever and to the following interest one and a portion of the said Roderick Lope or his representatives may and shall at any time hereafter being requested by either of the parties to these presents proceed to sell all and every the said Roderick Lope ready money all or so much of the above mentioned property as will be sufficient to pay and satisfy each of the above mentioned debts interest and expenses that may accrue thereon in due and lawful manner And the said Roderick Lope shall give ten days previous notice of said property by public advertisement of the same to the said Roderick Lope each of the said parties to these presents have hereto set their hands and affix their seals this day and date wherein written

In the Court of the 27th of April 1835 Mrs. Indenture was acknowledged by Richard Barker one of the parties thereto and proved by the oaths of Allen Beale and William. Esqrs. two of the Justices of the Peace and recorded as a Court Book for the above as being of Full age on the 1st May 1835. The Indenture as aforesaid was entered upon the proceedings of the day.

This Indenture made this 1st day of January 1535 between Ephraim Elliott of the County of Kent and late of about a certain part of the one part and late of the County of Kent and late of the other part, as my self, that the said Ephraim Elliott for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred and thirty three shillings and thirty pence and one third pence to him or his heirs paid at or before the signing and delivery of these presents the receipt and payment of the said purchase money have granted bargained and sold aliened and confirmed unto them the said John Bates his heirs and assigns one certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Middlesex and containing by a late Survey being then made the half of land, as appears in him or right of his heirs wife, I myself and my heirs and assigns that in the division of the Lands of William Bates as an aide more fully appears by the Report of the Commissioners filed in the Chancery Office of the County Court of Middlesex who order a decree of the said County Court of Middlesex and so the said bargained premises being conveyed to them the said John Bates his heirs and assigns forever by charter with all and singular the appurtenances people and customs as to the same belonging as in any more appearing and I the said Ephraim Elliott doth hereunto my hand execution and above hereby was sent and depend a good and perfect right and title unto the said John Bates his heirs and assigns against the claims or claims of any person or persons while ever I remaineth alive and the said Ephraim Elliott doth hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the day and year date above written signed and sealed
