to go privately to the said Catherine Brown and receive her assent or agreement of the same and
to assure her privately and apart from her husband which she hath executed the said deed and
notwithstanding the possession or claims of her husband and whether she is willing the said deed
should be recorded in the County Court of our said County and where you have. From and her assent
and to deliver the same to the Court in witness that you do truly and openly by deed under your hand
