This Indenture made and entered into this 5<sup>th</sup> day of June 1835 between James W. Parker and Martha his wife  
husband and wife of the one part and Joseph H. Parker of the other part both of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia  
Witnesseth that that the said James W. Parker and Martha his wife for and consideration of the sum of  
Twenty thousand dollars to them now paid by the said Joseph H. Parker the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged  
have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain sell and convey unto the said Joseph H. Parker  
a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and containing by  
Estimation two hundred and twenty five acres to him known as the farm now or by former name of Cedar Creek belonging  
at present to the bank of the Spring Branch being the aforesaid tract of land of the aforesaid tract  
in laying off the lands belonging to the Estate of Captain A. Parker said to the several lots by him by  
a line of marked trees and a stream of the road commonly called Cedar Creek leading to a cedar oak a corner  
tree for said land and the land belonging to Boston A. Parker from thence by a line of marked  
trees to a large pine a corner tree between the said land and the land allotted to Joseph H. Parker in the aforesaid  
division thence by a line of marked trees to the beginning I have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with  
the appurtenances thereto belonging to him the said Joseph H. Parker his heirs and assigns forever and the said  
James W. Parker and Martha his wife for themselves their heirs successors and administrators with  
herself Conant and legacy to and with the said Joseph H. Parker his heirs and assigns shall be the said party  
to the said party and Martha his wife their heirs and the said heirs and assigns of the said tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances  
unto him the said Joseph H. Parker his heirs and assigns against themselves and James W. Parker  
and Martha his wife their heirs and assigns and all persons whomsoever shall and will by these presents  
forever warrant and defend In testimony whereof the said James W. Parker and Martha his wife  
have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and date above written.

This Indenture made and entered into this 25<sup>th</sup> day of May in the year of our Lord 1835 between Joseph Drury  
of the first part and Joseph Drury of the second part both of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia  
Witnesseth that whereas the said Joseph Drury died on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of July 1834 leaving his estate to the said Joseph  
Drury in trust the said Joseph Drury in order to secure certain sum of money  
therein specified owing by him the said Joseph Drury to a certain Henry J. Woodruff & William  
Kitchen Convey or trust to the said Joseph Drury a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the  
County of Southampton on the north side of Stowaway river and the said sum therein mentioned  
having been fully paid by the said Joseph Drury to the said Henry J. Woodruff and  
William Kitchen the said Joseph Drury hath requested that the aforesaid Convey or trust be  
deed in trust to him the said Joseph Drury with his goods & he now releases to him the said  
Joseph Drury This Indenture therefore witnesseth that for and consideration aforesaid  
and also for and consideration of one dollar by the said Joseph Drury to the said C. Drury  
in hand paid before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby  
acknowledged by the said Joseph Drury by and with the consent of Henry J. Woodruff  
and William Kitchen have granted released and given unto him the said  
Joseph Drury his heirs and assigns forever all the estate right title interest property claim and  
use and what ever in law or equity of him the said Joseph Drury of and to the aforesaid  
tract of land with the appurtenances I have and to hold the aforesaid tract of land with its  
appurtenances unto the said Joseph Drury his heirs and assigns to him to keep all
