This Indenture made and entered into this 15th day of November 1824 between Richard P. Day
the first part Edward Price and John Baskham the third part whereas the said Richard
P. Day as joint and several the said John Baskham the sum of five hundred and ten dollars
and interest money of Virginia now or ever demand as well appear by having reference to the note being
signed date with their parents and carrying interest from the date of said note until paid and
the said Richard P. Day being desirous to secure the payment of the same unto the said John
Baskham and more especially for the sum of four dollars to him at hand paid by the said Richard P.
Day this Indenture witnesseth that the said Richard P. Day doth relinquish all his right title and
interest in the sum which of John Day and me in the proportion of thirteen to six and
one half to which total the said Richard P. Day doth grant bargains and sell unto the said
John Baskham his heirs and assigns forever with all and singular the appurtenances to the
said sum right belonging or in any way appertaining to have and to hold the said sum part of his
sons both personal and real estate hereby conveyed unto the said Edward Price his heirs and
assigns forever upon trust nevertheless that the said Edward Price his heirs and assigns
shall as soon as the said John Baskham requires that he proceed to sell the part of the
said sum both of real and personal estate or as much thereof as may be deemed necessary
to the highest bidder at publick Auction for cash sum giving at least ten days previous notice
of the same by advertisement at the Court house door and at least the other publick places where
said the town and place of sale at her own discretion and out of the money arising from the sale
having first discharged all expenses shall pay the said John Baskham the amount so
of debt and interest and shall pay the balance of money over to the said Richard P. Day
his heirs executors or assigns but of the said Richard P. Day shall fully satisfy the said
debt and interest then the residue shall be and remain to him as his
free and warrant in presence of all his friends I am John Baskham Richard P. Day
