 heirs or demand of any person or persons claiming or demanding the same or any part or

 explained to her she the said Stacey Rochelle acknowledged the same to be her act and
 deed and declared that she bore all things signed sealed and delivered the same and that

In the before offered the 10th May 1825 This Indenture was made
 by Clemente Rochelle and together with a Certificate thereon endorsed certifying the acknowledgment
 and being examination of Stacey Rochelle wife of the said Clemente Rochelle the parties hereto
 and advised to record and at a Court held for the aforesaid County of Southampton on 2nd June
 1825. This Indenture and Certificate as aforesaid were entered upon the proceedings of the
 day.

This Indenture made this 25th day of January in the year of our Lord 1825 between
 James Clayton and Amelias his wife of the parish of St. Mary and County of Southampton of the one
 part and William L. Stephenson of the same County and parish of the other part Witnesseth that the
 said James Clayton and Amelias for and in consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars
 of good and lawful money of England to them or hand paid by the said William L. Stephenson
 about the evening and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof she do hereby acknowledge
 themselves fully and amply satisfied contented and paid and thereof do acquit the said William
 L. Stephenson his heirs and assigns forever and grant bargain sell alien release and
 confirm and by their present deed grant bargain sell alien release and confirm
 unto the said William L. Stephenson his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or
 parcel of land and premises with the appurtenances now in the tenures and occupation of
 the said William L. Stephenson situated and being with the former parcel one half
 or the south side of Sea Camp Swamp containing by Estimation on hand and now
 be the same more or less and bounded as follows: Beginning at sea to the bridge
 then in the road to a pine standing in Swimmers line thence a line of marked trees
 to a second Swamp thence up the main run of said Swamp to the bridge and the
 house at James Clayton's building yard. Gardens orchard trees swamp water water course
 people heretofore and appurtenances to the said land belonging or in any way apper-
 taining the same right title and interest that property tract property claim or demand
 and whatsoever of them the said James Clayton and Amelias his wife granted to the said
 and every part thereof To have and to hold the said plantations
