 hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year date above written.

The Indenture made this 28th day of January in the year of our Lord Christ 1825. Between
 James Clayton and Annisther wife of the parson of Astbury and County of Lancashire of the one
 part and William G. Stephenson of the same County and parish of the other part witnesseth that the
 said James Clayton and Annisther for and consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars
 of good and lawfull money of Virginia to them on hand paid by the said William G. Stephenson
 aporently the reciting and delivery of these presents he receipting where the said James Clayton
 wherein paid and amply satisfied contented and paid and receipted as agent the said William
 G. Stephenson his heirs and assigns forever due and payable till all rents and
 Cogniss and by their present and grants long and well alredy received and confirmed
 unto the said James G. Stephenson his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract of
 land and premises with its appurtenances now in the tenure and occupation of
 the said William G. Stephenson situated and lying with others of said town
 on the south side of Sea Coke Swamp containing by estimation one hundred acres
 be the same more or less as bounded as follows Beginning at a tree at the head
 shore the road to a fence standing in Swampland then thence a line of trees to a
 black swamp then up the main run of said swamp to the bridge and so
 house at lower Edgels buttings yard. Gated orchard trees swamp water back
 property heretofore and appurtenances to the said land belonging or in any way appur-
 tenance the same right title interest and trust property back property shown to
 and wherewof them the said James Clayton and Annisther wife of him to the same
 and every part thereof to have and to hold the said plantation back
