Candle mould one pair of iron mallets eight shillings and eight pence and sixteen cups and saucers ten boys six sheep two cows and calves and whereas it hath been agreed that the said Mary Kitchin for and in consideration of the love and affection which she the said Mary Kitchin had for her the said Mary Williams do all after the decease of her the said Mary Williams have enjoy and possess the and her former all the property and every part of it together with all and every part of the increase and profits arising therefrom to be had and enjoyed and possessed by her the said Mary Kitchin and there and assigns from and after the decease of her the said Mary Williams forever Item That Indenture is so stipulated that in pursuance of the before recited agreement and in witness whereof the sum of one dollar of lawful money of the Commonwealth of the said Virginia in Land paid to the said Elizabeth Kitchin at and before the making and delivery of these presents; the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Mary Williams her grant bargain and sell assigned transference and set on record by these presents as the grant bargain sell assign for and on behalf of the said Elizabeth Kitchin her executors and assigns in the said property to wit one negro woman Sarah with all her increase one negro boy Jack Gal. Seas as also all her increases one negro boy Jack two feather beds and furniture the value to wit eight sitting chairs
