This Indenture made and executed this 17<sup>th</sup> day of June in the year of our Lord 1825 between Andrew Henry Battle of the first part Thomas Moore of the second part and Andrew Meddleton of the third part Examined of all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia witnesseth that whereas the said Thomas Moore stands bound as security for the said Henry Battle for his payment rendered in the Superior Court of Southampton County amounting to about two hundred and eighty dollars and sundry costs and sheriff's Commissions at the time also in a note of hand of five dollars will make from the day of 11 And the said Henry Battle being anxious and willing to secure and save himself up the said Thomas Moore from all loss damage or other injury as well from the payment of the money or any part thereof which he the said Thomas Moore stands bound as security for him in any way had agreed and do freely agree to carry over the said Andrew Meddleton as trustee all his lands as well that in possession and remainder as that he has now in his possession after this Indenture further notwithstanding that he and consideration of the circumstances as well for an recollection of the sum of one dollar in hand paid to the said Henry Battle by the said Andrew Meddleton until the time whereof the said Henry Battle doth hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Andrew Meddleton and his heirs forever a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County aforesaid containing by estimation forty acres to the same more or less situated in the said town place called Grange Town in the County aforesaid also another tract containing forty three acres bounded by the will him to mind the land of Grange Battle the land of Francis Fletcher formerly Battle the land of Almon Battle the lands of Edesha Ottard the lands of Benjamin Blund and the lands of Peter Edward also etc of his eight little infant children as I demand in the land and plantation whereof the Grand mother Lucy Battle died seized and possessed of and now in the possession of her Grand mother Lucy Battle after first paying and satisfying the demand of Peter Edward to whom the two last pieces parts and tract of land is conveyed in trust as per deed of conveyance recorded in the County Court of Southampton on the 20<sup>th</sup> September 1824 to him and to his all the said lands and premises with the appurtenances thereto belonging to the said Andrew Meddleton his heirs executors and administrators upon this the express condition that he the said Andrew Meddleton his heirs or executors shall that at the request of either of the parties to this deed sell all or so much of the said land as will be sufficient ent to pay any money which the said Thomas Moore or his representatives may have had
