Convey and make over unto the said Patrick Dowd and his heirs for ever all the eight hills and land with following property to wit the plantation where the said land or lies to one in the last will and Testament of my Father Richard Johnson contains one hundred acres more or less belonging to him the said John Johnson. To have and to hold with all the rights and incidents of the said land property. further. Conveyed or intended to be Conveyed after attending the time and place the said County of Southampton for ten days previous to the return of the same to John Dowd cash and out of the money owing and or from the said John in the first place. pay of satisfy all costs attending the said sale as well as the expenses attending the said Conveyance and then pay off the debts aforementioned with interest as well as all other monies which may appear to be due and owing from the said John Johnson to the said Henry Soner by reason of any dealing between them or either of them or any other monies which may be due to the said John Johnson and the said John Johnson for damages herefor.
