This Indenture made the 15<sup>th</sup> day of April on the year of our Lord 1725 between Giles  
Parrett and Philip Parrett husband of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part  
and Lewis Worrell of the same County and State of the other, each of them of full age that the said Giles Parrett  
and Philip Parrett for and in consideration of the Sum of twenty one pound and fifty Pence current money  
of Great Brittain to them hereunto paid by the said Lewis Worrell also before the making and  
delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is being acknowledged have granted bargained and sold  
and by these presents do grant bargain sell alien convey and Confirm unto the said Lewis Worrell  
and his heirs forever one certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the County of Southampton  
and Parish of Saint Dunstons being the same tract or parcel of land which the said Giles Parrett purchaser  
of Archibald Bryant and wife Containing by estimation fifteen and five eighths acers be the same more or less  
and bounded as follows By Beginning at the corner of the Spring branch in said Giles Parrett's land  
thence along this line north 86. 580 poles thence at 78 811 poles thence to E 8 poles thence S 75. 8 poles  
thence S 82. 8 poles to the run of the Spring branch thence down the run of said branch S 70. 8 poles  
thence S 45. 6 poles to a black Gum corner of Lewis Worrell thence along said Lewis Worrell's land  
S 70. 46. 7 poles to a white oak standing on the run of said Spring branch corner of said Lewis  
Worrell in said Giles Parrett's land thence up the said Spring branch along said Giles Parrett's  
land N 18. 28 poles thence N 27. 412 poles to the first Station together with all right title and  
adv. claim or demand of an end to the said tract or parcel of land and premises well to  
appertainances thereto belonging or in any way appertaining. To have and to hold the said  
tract or parcel of land and premises well its appertainances as aforesaid unto him the said  
Lewis Worrell and his heirs forever to them his heirs and behoof of him the said Lewis  
Worrell and the said Giles Parrett and Philip Parrett for themselves their heirs executors  
or assigns do Covenant and agree to and with the said Lewis Worrell his heirs executors or  
assigns that they will by these presents covenant and forever defend the right and title of the above  
described land against the lawful claim or demands of all and every person or persons what  
soever he or they who of the said Giles Parrett and Philip Parrett the wife have bought let  
bought or sold and appears their seals the day and date first written contained
