This Indenture made the 18th July in the year of our Lord 1535 Between Robert Groomyn and Margaret P. Groomyn his wife of the one part And Augustum Pope of the other part touching the County of Southampton Writeth that the said Robert Groomyn for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred thundred and ten pounds to him on hand paid by the said Augustum Pope at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Augustum Pope his heirs and assigns forever the following plantation tract or parcel of land containing by recent Survey thirty nine acres more or less which said plantation tract and parcel of land was purchased by the said Robert Groomyn of Augustum Pope at long the tract of land which was sold by said Augustum Pope as trustee for the benefit of Petting At Plaines dees (which said more fully appears by reference to a deed on Trust from Pet to Paris bearing date the 17th December 1521 and recorded the 15th April 1532) To have and to hold to the said tract of land with all the profits Commodities advantages and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appurtening to the said Augustum Pope his heirs and assigns forever to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Augustum Pope his heirs and assigns And the said Robert Groomyn doth fully Covenant and agree with the said Augustum Pope his heirs and assigns and the said Robert Groomyn his heirs and assigns to warrant and defend the right and title in and to the said land and all against the claims or demands of all and every person whatsoever claiming by through and under them. In witness whereof the said Robert Groomyn and Margaret P. Groomyn his wife have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year above written

This Indenture made the 5th day of April in the year of our Lord Edward First, between William Capell, and Thomas Lord Bp. of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Samuel Champer of the County of Sussex and State aforesaid of the other part. Witnesseth that the said William Capell and Thomas Lord Bp. do and recommend one of the sum of one hundred and fifty several good and lawful man of Virginia to them in trust by the said Samuel Champer the sole except whome they do send each of them well being within twelve years, granted he have and sold and by their presents do freely grant buy sell and sell alien enfeoff release and Convey unto the said Samuel Champer his heirs executors and assigns one certain tract or parcel of land situate lying
