brances whatsoever and that they have full right good power and lawful authority to grant sell
and convey the same being remaining and depending the legal title thereof to the said Samuel
Chapman his heirs for not only against themselves but against all and every other person whatsoever

This Indenture made this 20th day of June 1725, Between Bailey Barnes of the County of Montserrat
 of the first part and Thomas Edholley of the same County of the other part, Witnesseth that the said
 Bailey Barnes in consideration of the sum of one thousand dollars law full money of Virginia
 to him in hand paid Have given granted bargained and sold and by these presents do give grant
 bargain and sell unto the said Thomas Edholley and his heirs forever one certain tract or
 parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton containing for him and his heirs
 Eight acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows East and South by the lands of
 Hunt Swamp west by the land of both aunc Whitehead and South by the land of William
 Abston the said land being the land that the said Bailey Barnes purchased of Henry Poole
 and Hebraiah Abston which were more fully appoynted by reference to deed and records. To
 have and to hold the aforesaid tract of land together with their appurtenances to him the
 said Thomas Edholley and his heirs forever and the said Bailey Barnes him and each
 of his heirs East and adjoin the aforesaid tract or parcels of land with their appurtenances
 to him the said Thomas Edholley, his heirs and assigns forever with full power and full warrant of
