hundred and ten dollars paid to the said Jacob Ranney by the aforesaid John Estabrook at and before the date and
delivered of this present Receipt whereof Jacob Ranney doth by these
present Indemnify and Confirm unto the said John Estabrook or his attorney his assigns heirs or executors
Land one of which containing by estimation one hundred and forty acres or more bounded as follows by the
Lands of Joseph Blundell How Cland and Jane Cland, the other known as the South Plantation contain-
ing by estimation one hundred and forty acres or more bounded by the land of Joseph Blundell
and the above described tract of Land to have and to hold the aforesaid land and premises with their
appurtenances unto him the said John Estabrook his heirs and assigns forever and the aforesaid
Jacob Ranney doth hereby covenant to and will the aforesaid John Estabrook for himself of his heirs
and assigns to warrant and forever defend the right and title of the aforesaid John Estabrook in the following
personal property tract one negro man named Hall one white named Hartley one white named Dennis
one black named Abraham and one black named Brown one negro woman named Jenny and
her two children Sam and Lucy his slaves and three miles and the Crop of Cotton raised
this year (1825) and to know the residue of his Stock consisting of hens and hogs
also his house lots and kitchen front two all of which the said Jacob Ranney first conveys and
agrees for himself his heirs and assigns forever to warrant and defend the title of against
all and every claim or claim of every person or persons whatsoever unto the said John Estabrook
his heirs and assigns forever and special trust and confidence that of the aforesaid Jacob
Ranney shall refuse or neglect to pay or cause to be paid unto the aforesaid John Estabrook
his heirs and assigns the aforesaid sum of one hundred and twenty one dollars together
with the interest thereon according to the rate of six per cent and legal charge that the aforesaid John
Estabrook shall make of himself or at the request of the said John Estabrook shall at any time after
the twenty fifth day of December next having given ten days notice there or more shall make
place in the County exposed to sale for ready money all or so much of the above property as will
satisfy the aforesaid claims or demands and if from the proceeds of such sale there should be a
balance after satisfying the said debt costs and charges the said John Estabrook shall pay
over such balance to the said Jacob Ranney or his order on demand A W D off
Witness for the said Jacob Ranney and John Estabrook as Presidents at our County
and affix our seals the day and year above written signed sealed and delivered
