To have & to hold with all the rights and interest of the said Lydia Bassett therein Conveyed or intended to be Conveyed to the said Johnson Raiford his heirs & assigns forever upon such special conditions as shall be set forth in the said Johnson Raiford his Deed or accord in proportioning thereunto required by the said Charles G. Lyde or his legal representative & shall proceed to sell all the rights and interest of the said Lydia Bassett to the above named for forty Pounds Conveyed after advertising the time and place in the said County of Southampton for ten days previous at some publick place for cash and out of the money aforesaid to be paid in the first place pay and satisfy all costs attending the said sale as well as the expense attending the conveyance and then pay off a balance due of the said Bond as shall be necessary to satisfy the debts which may come against the Estate of Samuel Bassett the deceased Husband of the said Lydia Bassett mentioned and the said Lydia Bassett for herself her heirs Executors and administrators the right and title of the said property unto the said Johnson Raiford his heirs and assigns forever with full power and authority to sell the same for the sum of forty Pounds Conveyed to the said Lydia Bassett to her own use & benefit to make up the payment of the above named bond and on that date the said Johnson Raiford on his part agrees to make sale of the rights and interest of the property Conveyed for the best price he can obtain for the same and pay off the charges and the land charges or as much as is needful for the purpose aforesaid and the said Johnson Raiford for himself his Executors and administrators agrees to release the said Lydia Bassett from this encumbrance upon her pay off to the said Charles G.
