Whereas all men by their presents that I George Blom of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia for divers good Causes and Considerations do emancipate and set at liberty my negro man Benoit likewise called Ben Scott aged about fifty years and do hereby for myself my heirs Executors and adon quit all claim or pretensions of claim either to him personally or to any property which he has hitherto acquired or that which he may hereafter acquire and him the said Ben to enjoy as full free and unincumbered liberty as he had not been in bondage.
