the said Joseph Bynum said Eventh Bryant his heirs or assigns have given power to the my self or my executors & trustees to receive and pay to the said Charles Bryant his executors or assigns the sum of twenty five dollars forty four Cents with the interest which shall have accrued thereon before the date when the said Charles Bryant his executors or assigns may or shall require the same then the indenture and every thing herein contained to be done and of force effect but if the said Joseph Bynum his heirs or assigns shall or do not pay the said sum of twenty five Dollars forty four Cents with the interest which have accrued thereon before the day mentioned of the aforesaid sum shall be demanded as aforesaid then upon the request in the writing either of the said Charles Bryant or assigns or of the said Joseph Bynum his heirs the said Eventh Bryant may and shall sell and dispose of the above property named in full part thereof as may be required for the payment of the said sum of money and obtain a Public Auction for ready money in the said County giving at least twenty five days previous publick notice of the time and place of sale by advertisement posted up in and least three publick places within said County and out of the Province of Newf<sup>r</sup>land after paying and satisfying all Cents and any sum of money thereon remaining in the hands of the said Eventh Bryant as to be paid over by the said Joseph Bynum to the said Joseph Bynum by these presents warrant and forever defene. Know all men by these presents that I George Blom of the County of Southampton and State of Virginias for divers good Causes and Considerations do emancipate and set at liberty my negro man Bowles heretofore called Ben Scott aged about fifty years and I do hereby for myself my heirs executors and adon quit all claim or pretension of claim either to him personally or to any property which he has hitherto acquired or that which he may hereafter acquire and have the said Ben to enjoy as full free and unaffidable liberty as he had with me in his bondage In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 15<sup>th</sup> day of September 1825
