This Indenture made this 6 day of September eighteen hundred and thirty four between Samuel Jones and Elizabeth his wife and James Stanton and Thomas Jones of this part and all the County of Southampton witnesseth that for and consideration  
of the sum of one thousand dollars to them in hand paid by the said Thomas Jones the receipt whereof the said Samuel Jones and Elizabeth his wife doth hereby acknowledge and have a right and discharge the said Thomas Jones his heirs and assigns  
shall granted bargained and sold and by this present doth grant bargain sell and confine unto the said Thomas Jones his heirs and assigns  
one certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton containing one hundred and fifteen acres to the  
Somerset or Elton bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a tree near the mouth of a small stream which is a branch of the deep brook running by  
said Branch to the first stone upon the west spring of said brook to a pine marked tree at the head thereof thence along the west side of  
a corn tree in Brooks line thence along said Brooks line of marked trees to a pine a corner in Bulle's line thence along said Bulle's  
line of marked trees to a pine a corner standing in the head of a Branch in Brooks line thence down the same  
being Brooks line to a white oak on the side of the said Branch another corner to a red oak thence along the said line of marked trees down to the line between the said  
Brooks Branches and the said Jones Stanton to a Branch commonly called the middle Branch thence down the said branch  
to the run of round hill swamp thence down the run of the said swamp to the beginning together with all the appurtenances thereto  
unto belonging also all the right title interest property and claim and demand whatsoever of them the said Samuel Jones  
and Elizabeth his wife and James Stanton and Amos his wife and their heirs of in or to the same or any part thereof  
have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with all lands singularly the appurtenances thereto belonging unto  
the said Thomas Jones his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and benefit of him the said Thomas Jones his  
heirs and assigns and the said Samuel Jones and Elizabeth his wife and James Stanton and Amos his wife  
for themselves and their heirs the above mentioned Land and premises against them and their heirs and against  
all other person or persons who forever shall and will remain and forever dispense by this presents In witness
