 eight hundred and twenty five between William Joyner of the County of Southampton of the
 one part and Henry Joyner of the same County of the other part witnesseth that the said William
 Joyner for and in consideration of the sum of eight hundred dollars current money of Virginia
 to him the said William Joyner and paid by the said Henry Joyner at or before the end
 of a week to come calling and delivery of these presents to the receipt whereof the said William Joyner doth hereby ac-
 knowledge and thereupon acquit and therefrom acquit and discharge the said Henry Joyner his
 heirs Executors and Administrators by the presents he the said William Joyner hath granted
 bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Henry
 Joyner and to his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being
 in the County aforesaid containing by estimation two hundred and eighty two acres more or less
 and bounded as follows on the south by the lands of Solomon Plyler on the west by the lands of
 John Davis on the east by the lands of Gordon Turner and on the north by the lands of
 Amos Gardner deceased and the river and Rappahannock River and
 by every other way and place through and
 across and profits thereof and all the estate right title interest property claim and demand
 William Joyner has or to have over and above the sum of one thousand dollars
 notwithstanding the just value on account of Land with its appurtenances unto the said Henry
 Joyner his heirs and assigns forever to him freely, properly and fully of whom the said
 Henry Joyner has been and is present for and the said William Joyner for himself
 his heirs executors and administrators doth hereby covenant and grant to and with the said
 Henry Joyner his heirs and assigns that he the said William Joyner the above granted Land
 with the appurtenances unto the said Henry Joyner his heirs and assigns forever
