WHEREAS BY AND act of the General assembly of Virginia passed January the first day in the year 1819  
intituled an act establishing several Towns among other things it was enacted that ten acres of land in  
Monroe Town or the property of Clements Rochelle in the County of Southampton  
soon as the Town shall be laid off and lots will be established a Town to be  
name of MONROE and that John Thomas James Rochelle John Rochelle Benjamin Blunt Jr.  
Jacob Larder and William S. Everett Gentleman more fully appears trustee for the purpose then  
mentioned and whereas the said ten acres of land hath been off with lots as the Coronado Club  
settled to the above recited act of the General assembly and the said Clements Rochelle hath  
sold one of the said lots known by the plan of said Town by December 23 to a certain  
William Ricks. Now This Indenture made this first day of May in the year  
of our Lord 1818 between the said Clements Rochelle and Nancy his wife, his wife, his wife,  
and owners of land ten acres of land and the said trustee under the above named  
act of Assembly of the one part and the said William Ricks of the other part witnesseth  
that the said Clements Rochelle and the said Nancy his wife doth for the sum of  
aforesaid for and in consideration of the premises and for the further Consideration  
sixty dollars to the said Clements Rochelle in Land paid by the said William Ricks  
at and before the inscating and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof  
said Clements Rochelle doth hereby acknowledge and for ever quit claim  
the said William Ricks of the same place granted by and to him self  
and Conveyed and by their presents do grant buy and sell alien off and Confer  
with the said William Ricks on Lot in the said Town of Monroe known in the plan of said  
Town by December 23 Connampton half acre and bounded on the north  
end bounded by Anderson Street on the east side bounded by Tolman Hayes lot on the south  
bounded by Simon Murfet lot and on the south end bounded by a Lane running by the  
west Rochelle together with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging and  
now appertaining to have and to hold the said Lot with all and singular the appur  
tenances therunto belonging to the said William Ricks his heirs and assigns forever  
and the said Clements Rochelle doth hereby give and grant his heirs successors of whom  
Connampton and agree to and with the said William Ricks his heirs and assigns to warrant  
and defend the right and title we and to the said Lot against the claims or law  
demand or demands of all and every person whatsoever. The witness whereof the parties  
above named have hereunto set their names and affixed their seals the day and year above  
seems sealed and delivered on presentments

deed and declare that she has willingly signed said deed & delivered the same and the  
she wished not to retract it given under our hands and seals this 1<sup>st</sup> day of October
