This Indenture made this 2nd day of the 1st moth of June Last, Edward, 1st Baron Talley, Rector, Henry Rector, and Emory Rector of the one part, and Charles Ellet of the other part, of the County of York, in the parish of St. Mary and St. of St. Mary, do hereby certify that the said Talley, Henry and Emory Rector in consideration of the sum of five dollars in hand paid and of the value of lawful money of the Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said Charles Ellet at and before the signing and delivery of this present indenture, whereby he hath acknowledged that he has given and do by these presents in full of all claims and demands that he has or shall have unto the said Charles Ellet his heirs and assigns, right title interest claim or demand to and in a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County and parish aforesaid, bounded by a certain Henry Rector and containing by estimation one hundred & 50 acres of the same more or less and bounded on the north by the lands of Samuel Branch and Samuel Jones on the west by the lands of John Clayton on the east by the lands of Henry Deane and one tract by the lands of Samuel and Samuel Pennington, the whole often being made William Talley, of the one part, together with all the appurtenances thereto, not however word image estate and estate, certain Commencement advantage, time, manner, benefit, use and convenience whatsoever to the said land, belonging or in any way or appurtenance to the same or any part or part thereof, to have and to be to the said land, with the premises herein before mentioned, as extended to his heirs with every part & parcel thereof, with every claim right claim or demand, whatsoever, unto the said Charles Ellet his heirs and assigns forever to and for the only proper use of him the said Charles Ellet his heirs and assigns forever and the said Talley, Henry and Emory Rector, their heirs and their heirs the said right title interest claim or demand to the said land, herein before mentioned, with the premises and appurtenances thereto, hereby being, unto the said Charles Ellet his heirs and assigns free from the claim or demand of whom the said Talley, Henry and Emory Rector or either of them in or color of claim claim or sell, and every other person or persons whatsoever shall or will warrant or prove before by their presents.
