of one dollar hundred and fifty dollars of lawful money of the Commonwealth to have in hand paid by the said trustees this day before the recording  
and delivery of these presents doth acknowledge fully acknowledged that the said bargains and sales are set and do by these presents doth make of them  
with his wife Bell unto the said trustees their husband and wife joint and several right title interest claim or demand to do in a certain tract  
of land lying and being in the County and parish of Prince George by a certain Henry Price and containing by estimation one hundred &  
two acres to the same more or less and bounded on the north by the lands of Russell Branch and Samuel Price on the east by the lands of John Crayton  
on the south by the lands of Wiley Butler and on the west by the lands of Samuel and Lammot Bonette reference to the hills after being made  
allowing fully up and together with all and singular the houses and houses world images waters and waters Corres Communitie advantages emer-  
gents habitations and appurtenances whatsoever to the said land belonging or in any way appertaining to the same or any  
parts or land thereof to trust and to hold the said land with the houses thereon before mentioned or intended to be sold with every part of  
said tract and every of their rights claims or demands whatsoever unto the said Charles E. Bell his heirs and assigns forever to use for his  
the only proper use of him the said Charles E. Bell his heirs and assigns forever and the said Henry Smith and Emily Price  
for themselves and their heirs the said right title interest claim or demand to the said land herein before mentioned with the houses  
and appurtenances thereto belonging unto the said Charles E. Bell his heirs and assigns free from all claim or claim of whom soe ever.
