Witnesses of agreement made and entered into this day of November 1825 between Edward Ritter a widow of singular large choulds and caults of Henry Pitts deceased and his infant son Robert Henry Pitts her son by her late husband Martha now deceased and formerly Martha Pitts and Eliza Pitts widow of Robert Henry Pitts her son by her late husband Eliza Pitts which said Martha and Eliza were the daughters of the said Henry Pitts deceased and Robert Henry Pitts and Eliza were his heirs at law of the first part and Elizabeth Pitts formerly Elizabeth Pitts widow of the said Henry Pitts who does certify witnesseth that she said Edward Ritter as widow of the said and at most friend to his said Son and the said Eliza Pitts who are hereof the said Henry Pitts does do grant sell and convey by these presents to the said Elizabeth Pitts all their right title and interest in and to all the property real and personal of every description with the exception which the said Henry Pitts acquires any title or interest by his entitling marriage with the said Elizabeth Pitts then Elizabeth Pitts widow of John Pitts and further agrees to pay to her the sum of two hundred dollars of good and lawful money and the said Elizabeth widow of the said Henry Pitts notwithstanding the payment hereinabove made and former quiet claimants unto the said Pitts of the deceased all their right of claim in other property both real and personal with the exception left by the said Henry Pitts her late husband at the time of death and the said Covenant with them that neither shall any one claiming by virtue of her said marriage suppose any claim to the same or any part thereof This testimony whereof the parties have countersigned this day and date the same day of your first return written

This Indenture made this 25th day of March 1825 Between William Bottom and Kevill Harry
both of Southampton County and state of N. Carolina witnesseth that I the said William Bottom for and a
consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars to me in hand paid by the said Kevill Harry do myself
whereof a hearty fully acknowledge have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bough
sell and deliver unto the said Kevill Harry his heirs and assigns forever all my right title for land
in and to Harry Marples Estate late of Southampton County and formerly of Loudoun County
(Virginia) which he derives from his father Henry Marples deceased and his mother Sarah Thompson deceased
of Southampton County Virginia the right and title to all my right and title to the aforesaid Estate
rescind and defend forever unto the said Kevill Harry his heirs and assigns forever. Given this day
