sum of One hundred and fifty dollars to him paid to him or his credit to be paid by the said Master Brattle  
at or before the Executing of delivery of these presents he receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged doth  
bargain and sell and doth by these presents begone and sell unto the said Master G. Brattle his heirs  
and assigns one certain tract of land lying and being in the County of Southampton  
containing by estimation one hundred and forty four acres to the same more or less and bounded  
by the lands of Jeptha P. Washington Jeptha Bailey Henry White Great Washington and John Gould  
together with all and singular the appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any way appertaining  
and the warden and conservator remainder and terminators yearly and otherwise profits  
profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof to have and to hold the said tract of land with  
the buildings thereon and all and singular other the premises herein before mentioned  
or intended to be bargained sold and every part and parcel thereof with every of their rights  
members and appurtenances unto the said Master G. Brattle his heirs and assigns forever to  
the said William Washington for himself and his heirs the said land to be held by him
