This Indenture made this 19th day of December in the year 1725 Between Simon Pope of one part & Richard Dardson of the other, both of the County of Dorset, for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred and thirty seven dollars and fifty Cents to him the said Simon Pope in hand paid at and before the finalizing delivery of these presents by the said Richard Dardson the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said Simon Pope have granted bargained sold and Confirmed unto the said Richard Dardson his heirs and assigns forever one tract or parcel of Land lying in the County of Southampton and bounded as followeth

Commencing at a Corner tree a fence which divides the land of Nathaniel Pope Jr and John Jackson thence along the said Nathaniel Pope thence down to a large stone on the river straight across a line of marshes trees to a scrubby red oak thence along a line of marshes trees to the fence which divides Jacob Williams and Simon Pope thence along a line of marshes trees back to the first station it being the land that Simon Pope has from the estate of old Mr. Williams Pope Containing seventy five acres more or less with all its advantages whatever thenceunto belonging of To Have and to Hold the said bargained premises to him the said Richard Dardson his heirs and assigns forever and he the said Simon Pope hath bound his heirs and assigns do by these presents covenant and defend the said bargained premises against all Claims or demands whatsoever to him the said Richard Dardson his heirs and assigns forever In witness whereof the said Simon Pope has set his hand and affixed his Seal this day & date before written

And it is further more agreed upon that Simon Pope will pay the Clerk for recording this said indenture before signing it.

This Indenture made this 25th day of December 1726 Between Nathaniel Pope of the first part & John Pope of the second part and the said Nathaniel Pope & John Pope jointly and severally to the said John Pope for his security in the sum of twelve dollars and thirty Cents to be paid on the 21st of February 1727 with legal interest thereon according to the said Nathaniel Pope is content and descent to him. For This indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and also for the further Consideration of five dollars of lawful money of Virginia to the said Nathaniel Pope at and before the executing & delivery of these presents the receipt is hereby acknowledged he the said Nathaniel Pope hath given granted bargained sold aliened Enjoined Relinquished and Confirmed and by these presents such good grant bargained sold aliened Enjoined Relinquished and Confirmed to the said John Pope his heirs and assigns forever Four one Penny or black Col. six bars of Battle over in the hands of the said Nathaniel Pope in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia with legal interest thereon with all Conveyances of the above property amount of the above sum of twelve dollars and thirty Cents admitted to be lawfully under my hand Seal.
