This Indenture made this twenty seventh day of November one thousand eight hundred and forty five
between George B. Cary and Martha P. his wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and
Thomas A. Ridley of the same County of the other part witnesseth that said George B. Cary and
Martha P. are Aye for your consideration of the sum of Three thousand dollars to him or his
heire and Comf[ee] and by these presents do bargaine sell aliey & Confer unto the said Thomas
Ridley his heirs & assigns from a certain tract or parcel of Land lying situated Vlueing in said
Anplin County and bounded as follows locat Beginning at a small oak on Bucklehorn road formerly
Cross tree to said Miller's line thence along the said line to the long Branch thence down the
Branch as it meanders to a maple tree on the south side of said branch and marked a dressing tree
of the lands formerly said Miller's and John Taylors as appears by the recd of John Taylor to Miles
Cary made and indented on the 11th day of January 1798 and of acres in the County of Southampton
thence along said line to Bucklehorn Branch thence down the said Branch as it meanders to the mouth
of the River down branch where it enters into the aforesaid Bucklehorn Branch thence up the said River
down branch till it intersectes with said River thence as laid down in the survey of the land described
along said river to a hickory tree on Bucklehorn road thence along said road to the beginning
