This Indenture made and executed this 19th day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty five between George B. Cary Benjamin Branch and Emma his wife of the one part and her and killed of the other part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Witness that the said Benjamin Branch and wife for and in consideration of the Sum of Eight hundred and forty seven & 1/2 lawful money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said George B. Cary (or secured to be paid the receipt whereof the said Benjamin Branch and wife do fully acknowledge have granted bargain sold conveyed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and convey unto the said George B. Cary all the lands here expressed a certain tract or parcel of Land containing two hundred acres be the same more or less lying & being in the County of Southampton which was formerly Talbot's land - the 1/2 Callons and bounded as follows Court as in the original patent Beginning at a white oak on the north side of the Calow branch thence Company the said Branch South thirty degrees North seventy six poles to a white oak then west North west 241 poles to two pine stumps then North twenty five degrees East 112 poles to a Gum then South 80 degrees East one hundred and four poles to a pine on the run of a small branch then down the run of said Branch to the Calow branch of said land then down the run of the various courses of the Calow branch to the beginning all of which will fully appear by reference to the deed from Richard Smith to John Talbot dated 17th February 1773 also from said Talbot to Richard Talbot to George Talbot on the 12th day of August 1778 all of record in the Court of the County of said which was bequeathed in the last will and testament of the said George Talbot to Benjamin Branch party to these presents To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with the appurtenances thereto belonging to him the said George B. Cary and his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of the said George B. Cary his heirs and assigns forever And the said Benjamin Branch for himself his heirs executors and administrators doth hereby covenant & agree to and with the said George B. Cary his heirs and assigns that he the said Benjamin Branch and his heirs the said tract or parcel of Land with its appurtenances unto him the said George B.
