

Plats. Insp. This Indenture made the first day of March on the year 1825 between Alexander P. Tate and Elizabeth
 to his wife of the one part and Thomas Beauford Davis Randall James Esq. Trustees of the said John M.
Trustees William Lewis Thomas and Robertson Capell (Welshmen Trustees) for the benefit of the Methodist
 Episcopal Church witnesseth that the said Alexander P. Tate and Elizabeth his wife for and to
 promote the cause of religion have and do give grant and confirm to the said Trustees in
 trust for the benefit aforesaid a certain parcel or lot of land bounded as follows beginning at
 road oak run in George M. Tate's line thence East thirty yards to a post thence parallel with
 George Tate's line thirty yards to a post thence along the said Tate's line to the beginning
 to them and their Successors in Office for the time being or as long as the premises aforesaid
 may be kept occupied or used for religious purposes To have use to have the said lot of
 land with all its appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise appurtenances with all the
 privileges for the only proper use of the said Trustees and their Successors for the time being
 the same lot of land as a site for a meeting house to be exclusively occupied & used as a
 place of public worship to the entire Control of them the said Trustees or their Successors appointed
 by authority of the Methodist Episcopal Church in the United States of America and the said Alex-
 ander P. Tate and Elizabeth his wife for themselves and their heirs or assigns or either of them
 theirs and of all and every person or persons who shall will and do come and the persons
 possessors of the said land for the time and times here granted and conveyed do appear and
 witness whereof the said Alexander P. Tate and Elizabeth his wife have hereunto set their
 hands and seals the day and year first above written
