This Indenture made the first day of March on the year 1828 between Alexander P. Pete and Elizabeth
 his wife of the one part and Thomas Hopkings Isaac Wendell James Codd Peter Lewis and John W.
 Miller Lewis Thomas and Robertson Capell Gentlemen Trustees for the benefit of the Methodist
 Episcopal Church Waterfield that the said Alexander P. Pete and Elizabeth his wife for ever to
 promote the cause of religion have and do give grant and Convey to the said Trustees in
 trust for the benefit aforesaid a certain parcel or lot of land bounded as follows beginning at
 Red oak tree in George M. Bates line thence East thirty yards to a post thence parallel with
 George Bates line sixty yards to a post thence along the said Bates line to the beginning
 to them and their successors in office for the time being or as long as the premises aforesaid
 may be kept occupied or used for religious purposes to have and to hold the said lot of
 land with all its appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining with all its
 privileges for the only proper use of the said Trustees and their successors for the time being
 the same lot of land as a site for a meeting house to be exclusively occupied by them and reserved as
 place of public worship to the entire Congregation when the said Trustees or their successors appointed
 by authority of the Methodist Episcopal Church in the United States of America and the said Alex-
 ander P. Pete and Elizabeth his wife for themselves and their heirs or executors of them or either of them
 heirs and of all and every person or persons whatsoever shall well and truly warrant the peaceful
 possession of the said land for the time and uses here granted and Conveyed as appears in
 witness whereof the said Alexander P. Pete and Elizabeth his wife have hereunto set their
 hands and seals the day and year first above written.
