

Humbley dep. This Indenture made this thirty first day of December in the year of our Lord 1825 between
 Thomas Humbley and Gilly his wife of the parish of Stollaway and County of Essex respondents of the
 one part and George Gardner of the same parish and County of the other part 1825 of full
 legal age do hereby certify that the said Thomas Humbley and Gilly his wife for and in consideration of the sum of one
 hundred and forty five dollars and a half Current money of Virginia to them the said ^{their} Thomas
 and Gilly his wife in hand paid by the said George Gardner at or before the making & delivery
 of these presents the receipt whereof the said Thomas Humbley and Gilly his wife do hereby acknowledge
 And thereof And thereupon doth acquit and discharge the said George Gardner his heirs Executors
 and admors by these presents they the said Thomas Humbley and Gilly his wife do hereby grant
 bargain sell and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Geo Gardner
 and to his heirs and assigns forever One Certain tract or parcel of Lands lying and being in the parish
 and County aforesaid situate on one of the lots (or shares) in the hands of James Gardner deceased also
 all my right title interest in the land of James which was devised to his widow as her dower in
 the hands of James Gardner and which is mine Containing thirty five acres and whole eight
 and title in the said Lands and bounded by the Command of the said lands and the reversion
 and reversions remainder and remainders thereof and profits thereof and of every part thereof
 thereof and all the Estate right title interest property claim and demand whatsoever of them
 the said Thomas Humbley and Gilly his wife in and to the same To have and to hold the
 said tract or parcel of land and the whole right title in said lands with its appurtenances
 unto the said Geo Gardner and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of him the said
 Geo Gardner his heirs and assigns forever and the said Thomas and Gilly his wife for
 themselves their heirs Executors and admors doth hereby Covenant and grant to the said Geo Gardner
 his heirs & assigns that they the said Thomas Humbley and Gilly his wife the above granted premises
 with the appurtenances unto the said George Gardner his heirs and assigns against the lawful
 claim or demand of whom the said Thomas Humbley and Gilly his wife and their heirs against
 the claim or claims of all our said person or persons doth hold and sell by these presents forever
 warrant & defend In testimony whereof the said Thomas Humbley and Gilly his wife have hereunto
 set their hands and affixed their seals this day and year first above written
