This Indenture made and entered into this 21<sup>st</sup> day of December in the year of our Lord 1825 between James Mellickin of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and La Fayette Brown of the same & County of Southampton and State of Virginia aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that the said James Mellickin and Martha A. his wife for and consideration of the sum of thirty dollars Current money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said La Fayette Brown the receipt whereof the said James Mellickin and wife Martha A. doth hereby acknowledge and hereby acquit discharge the said La Fayette Brown from further payment on this behalf & have granted bargains and sold and do by their presents grant bargains and sell unto the said La Fayette Brown his heirs and assigns forever one certain Lot or parcel of Land and dwelling house and land on the Town of Monroe designated in the plat of said town by Lot No 22 Containing on half acre to be the sum more or less abiding the identical Lot which the said James Mellickin purchased of a certain Simon Gray and wife which said deed is now of record in the Clerk's Office of the County of Southampton for reference thereto being had the boundaries of which fully appear to have and to hold the aforesaid Lot No 22 and every part and parcel thereof to him the said La Fayette Brown his heirs & assigns forever free from the claims of all persons whatsoever shall and will by their present instrument and for ever defend the right and title to the said Lot of land as aforesaid. This Indenture made this 10<sup>th</sup> day of August in the year of our Lord 1825 between Elizabeth Anderson & Martha Anderson Mary Anderson and Nancy Anderson of the one part and Elizy Partrige of the other part witnesseth that the said Elizabeth Anderson, Martha Anderson, Mary Anderson and Nancy Anderson for and consideration of the sum of £100<sup>00</sup> of English money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said Elizy Partrige her husband the receipt whereof is freely acknowledged before the sealing and delivering of this indenture that the said Elizabeth Anderson & Martha Anderson, Mary Anderson and Nancy Anderson had granted bargains & sold unto the said Elizy Partrige to have and to enjoy on certain tract or parcel of land which abides and being in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia containing one hundred and forty six rods, their length and breadth as follows, to-wit Beginning at a place on the south side of the head of the creek a corner running between the opposite of William Marchand and his land thence along the line of said opposite land eighty eight degrees west an hundred & ten rods to a Cypas a corner there stand. Sixty degrees East One hundred forty rods to a point a corner on John McGraw's land thence North fifty eight degrees East thirty six rods to a black oak on John Stevenson's lot thence along the said road north Eighty three degrees East forty
