This Indenture made and entered into this 12th day of August 1825 in and between John Miles & Peggy his wife of Southampton County Virginie of the first part and Simon Murphy of the same County State of the second part And Ernest Mapenburg of the same County and State of the third part witnesseth that whereas the said John Miles stands jointly indebted unto the said S. Murphy on the first half year of thirty five dollars and thirty five cents lawful money of Virginia which appears by bond bearing Equal date with these presents and carrying interest from the date thereof the said John Miles and Peggy his wife being desirous to moderate the payment of the before mentioned debt but more especially for the sum of One dollar due to them on their part before the Executing and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged that they the said John Miles and Peggy his wife have granted bargained & sold and do by these presents grant bargain & sell to them the said Ernest Mapenburg his heirs and assigns forever One Acre or part of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton and Lower district of Chillicothe Parish containing One Hundred Ninety four acres more or less and bounded as follows by the Lands of William Lawrence Edward Simon Murphy and the said Seaman Vaughan tract of Land and the Cope tract of Land now in the said John Miles and Peggy his wife debt for one hundred Three score and eight dollars and all and every person or persons whatsoever manner and defend all right title claims or entreats in the said tract or part of Land to him the said Ernest Mapenburg his heirs and assigns forever upon the following trusts of the said John Miles and Peggy his wife shall fail to pay and discharge the above debt and all entitle him to have the lawful and right in that tract for him the said Ernest Mapenburg to have execute in writing from under the hand of him the said Simon Murphy his heirs or assigns to discharge and pay for each the above tract of Land after giving full notice by advertisement to ten days before sale and out of the money so raised pay the above debt and all costs pertaining to this tract and the overplus if any pay over to Chillicothe John Miles and Peggy his wife In witness whereof the parties hereto set our hands and seals this day of date first before mention signed sealed and delivered
