 said Polly Robertson be it further known to all to whom it may Concern that I the said Lewis
 Tick do hereby give grant alienate and Confirm unto the said Polly Robertson her heirs and
 assigns forever all the right title interest and Estate which I now or ever may hereafter have or and
 to one acre of the aforesaid Land sit being the acre or which the house in which the said
 Polly Robertson now dwells including the said house and all the personal Estate which I the
 said Lewis Tick have. Excepted a deed to Lewis Morrill for. Expressly for the benefit of
 the said Polly Robertson during her natural life by this deed of gift it is my object and I
 the said Lewis Tick do hereby convey to the said Polly Robertson the wife of the said Henry
 Robertson but in no way to the benefit of the said Henry Robertson the for example. First in
 all the property both real and personal which I the said Lewis Tick have. proceeds by convey
 to Lewis Morrill in trust for the benefit of the said Polly Robertson for her to have hold &
 enjoy the same and Every part thereof unto the said Polly Robertson and her heirs and of her
 heirs with the exception of the said Henry Robertson and I further more give & grant
 unto the said Polly Robertson and. privilege of getting from off any land of mine a sufficient
 fire wood for one chimney during the term of her own natural life and I the said Lewis
 Tick do for myself and my heirs forever hereafter warrant and defend the unto the said title
 unless I myself or in and to the said one acre of Land the three shewen standing and also all
 other improvements thereon and also all the personal property conveyed to Lewis Morrill in trust
