This Indenture made this 2<sup>d</sup> day of December 1825 by and between Jacob Garden of Southampton County Virginia of the one part and Mr. Hardy Crop of Southampton County in the same state of the other part. Whereas that whereas John Doughty late of the County of Southampton aforesaid did in his life time that is to say on the 2<sup>d</sup> day of March 1823 executed to the above named Jacob Garden a deed in trust for his tract of Land on the County of Southampton aforesaid containing one hundred eight acres bounded as on the said deed of trust is particularly expressed which deed of trust was to secure certain debts then due and owing to the said John Doughty as guardian to the orphan of Jacob Doughty dead and on his individual right and to endow fully the said Hardy Crop in certain security ships in value the said John Doughty after daily advertising the time and place as on the 8<sup>d</sup> day of this present month set forth the said John Doughty had seen at publick sale for ready money the tract of land aforesaid which was bid off by the above named Hardy Crop for the sum of One hundred and seventeen dollars and dollars on a settlement of the claim promissed for by the trust and aforesaid there appears to be due to the said Hardy Crop in reliance on the said trust an amount to be settled amounted to One hundred and seven dollars & Seven Cents leaving a balance of seven dollars Eighty nine Cents to be paid by the said Hardy Crop to the said Jacob Garden trustee which sum he hath truly paid before the ensueing delivery of them presents as a fully acknowledged by the said Jacob Garden A.M. Parker for and consideration of the promises aforesaid the said Jacob Garden as trustee as aforesaid hath granted bargained sold allers & confirmed and by them presents doth grant bargains sell allers & confirm unto him the said Hardy Crop and his heirs & assigns forever all the right title and interest which by the said trust aforesaid was created in him the said Jacob Garden or which he hath fully might or can sell in order to discharge the balances claimed to him of the debts promised for by him the said Hardy Crop to have and to hold the aforesaid right title interest to the said tract of land aforesaid to him the said Hardy Crop his heirs and assigns forever And for the said Jacob Garden for himself his heirs & assigns and to the said Hardy Crop present payment of present the interest under his bargain'd promises which is duly Conveyed or recked to the said Jacob Garden under all the circumstances attending the case lawfully might convey but no other to him the said Hardy Crop his heirs and assigns forever.
