power of attorney to receive any debts that may be due and accept for the same and as to be hereby and certify
that this power of attorney shall and does extend to any parts of the State of Virginia where we may have
business to transact in said State all which said debts and debts of our said attorney we hereby declare to be
legally binding on us if we were personally present at the doing thereof. And we of our own free will and
wits set our hands and seals this 21st day of January in the year 1826

This instrument made this 2nd day of January 1826 William P. Everett of the County of Southampton
and State of Virginia of the one part Robert J. Jones of the same County and State of the second part &
James Robb of the County and State of Virginia of the third part Whereas there is a marriage party
intended to be had and solemnized by the principals of God by and before the said William P.
Everett and Robert J. Jones and whereas the said William P. Jones is possessed of a considerable
estate both real and personal and also entitled to a proportion of the said said Estate of the said
James Robb Allen Jones and whereas it hath been agreed that the said William P. Everett should after
the said intended marriage have use and enjoy during the joint lives of them the said William P.
Everett and Robert J. Jones the interest and occupation of the whole Estate of said which the
said Robert J. Jones may be entitled to in any way whatsoever and that upon the death of either party
the said William P. Everett on the said Robert J. Jones and every part of the said Estate shall go
absolutely to the issue or issue of the said William P. Everett by the marriage to be shortly between
them and in the event of no such issue to the survivor having power to the survivor. It is intended
in the said Estate in the event of death of one and he has been expressly agreed by and between the
parties that neither the whole or any part of the said Estate shall be liable to any existing debt
of the said William P. Everett or any debt which he the said William P. Everett may be bound
or become during the joint lives of the said William P. Everett and Robert J. Jones and
any other debts provided the said Robert J. Jones should survive the said William P. Everett
having issue of their marriage at the end of the said term The instrument whereby the said
