This Indenture made and entered into this 28th day of December in the year of our Lord 1825 by and between John Jordan of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part and Jacob Parnes of the same County and State of the second part and George S. Gentry of the same County and State of the third part Whereas the said John Jordan stands justly indebted to the said Gentry in the sum of one hundred and five dollars by his bearing date the 15th day of December 1825 with the legal interest which shall accrue from the 17th day of December 1825 from the said John Jordan as witness and decision appears to them and appear to the said George S. Gentry. Now this indenture witnesseth that the said John Jordan as well as each and every one of the persons as of the sum of one dollar to him in three parts by the said Jacob Parnes at and before the enclosing delivery of this present the said receipt is hereby acknowledged and from every part of which the said Jacob Parnes and all his legal representatives are forever released discharged have granted bargained and sold and by their presents do fully grant bargain and sell unto the said Jacob Parnes his heirs and assigns as follows that is to say the said John Jordan have granted bargained and sold and do hereby grant bargain and sell unto the said Jacob Parnes his heirs and assigns the following property to wit 2 yearling 1 Cow half 1 bay Horse 1 Cart and wheels & harnesses and furniture 1 wheelbarrow 1 set Cows 10 Earthen plates 2 dishes 2 sets one set knives and forks six silver Spoons 1 Coffee pot and dish one one wheelbarrow 2 pots 1 sheet Linen one mass saddle and bridle 1 Lion Bone 1 Band slow spinners cloth 1 spinning wheel 2 working tools a pair Cotton Card & Bells 1 Pitcher & Suge 3 bottles one slate pen and flat iron 3 bars and jugs one chest of canvas two beds to have and to hold the said property before mentioned the right and title whereof the said Gentry forever warrant and defend against myself my heirs executors and assigns the said John Jordan of us to the same to him the said Jacob Parnes his heirs executors and assigns forever to the only proper use and behoof of them the said Jacob Parnes his heirs executors and assigns forever On which nevertheless that if the said John Jordan his heirs executors or assigns shall will and lawfully pay and deliver unto the said George S. Gentry his heirs executors or assigns the aforesaid sum of one hundred and five dollars with the interest which shall have accrued thereon or before the 27th day of December 1826 shall then this indenture and every thing herein contained is to be null and void and of no Effect But if the said John Jordan his heirs executors or assigns shall not pay the said sum of one hundred and five dollars with the interest which shall have accrued thereon or before the time herein specified the said George S. Gentry his heirs executors or assigns may require or moving the said Jacob Parnes to sell the aforesaid property or so much thereof as shall be sufficient to discharge the aforesaid sum of money and the necessary expenses of carrying into Effect when and where by giving due notice of the time place for such sale testimony whereof the parties have hereunto set their hands and seals this 28th day and year therein before written
