This Indenture made this 21st day of March 1826 between Henry Parson of the first part & James L. Newson of the second part all of the County of Southampton witnesses that the said Henry Parson for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to him in hand paid before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said James L. Newson certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in this County of Southampton by Estimation thirty four acres in the same more or less at being let who is agreeable to the report of the Commissioners appointed for the behoof of dividing the laws of Henry Parson and the matters of which said said State is a report of the Commissioners which is of record in this Court To have and to hold the said Land to the proper use and behoof of him the said James L. Newson his heirs and assigns forever and the said Parson for him self his heirs &c. the right and title unto the same warrant and defend by them pursuant to writing whereof I have hereunto set my hand and the day of the above written
