Hanson of the second part all of the County of Southampton 18th April that the said Henry Pearson for and in consideration of the sum of 200 pounds lawful to him in hand paid before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said James A. Hanson a certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in this County of Southampton by Estimation thirty four acres in the same more or less at being let to & agreeable to the report of the Commissioners appointed for the behoof of dividing the town of Henry Pearson and the matters and articles of which said State in a report of the Commissioners which is of record in the Court To have and to hold the said Lands to the proper use and behoof of him the said Hanson his heirs and assigns forever and the said Pearson for himself his heirs &c. the right and title unto the same was and doth remain by these presents in writing whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day of the date above written
