

At a Court held for the County of Southampton Thursday the 11th Day of March 1754.
This Indenture and the Memorandum endorsed was proved by the Oaths of Ambros Graggard Jesse Adams and Edward Cate the Wit. eses thereto and Ordered to be Recorded Test J. H. Wells C. B.

This Indenture made this 13th Day of March in year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and fifty four Between George Irie of the County of Southampton of the one part and Robert Hinnebrew of the County aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said George Irie for and in consideration of the sum of fifteen Pounds eight Shillings current Money of Virginia to me in hand paid by the said Robt. Hinnebrew the receipt whereof the said George Irie doth hereby acknowledge the said George Irie hath granted bargained and sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell alien and confirm unto the said Robt. Hinnebrew his Heirs and assigns forever one tract or Parcel of Land containing one hundred acres situate lying and being on the south side of Nottoway River and on the North side the three Creeks in the County of Southampton aforesaid and is bounded as followeth to wit beginning at a Poplar on the south side Plowman Swamp thence south ten Degrees West one hundred and three Pole to a red Oak thence North eighty Degrees West one hundred and sixty Pole to a pine thence North ten Degrees East fifty five Pole to a gum by the side of a small branch thence Down the various Courses of the run of the said branch to Plowman Swamp aforesaid and Down the various Courses of the run of the said Swamp to the beginning and also all Lands Trees Woods Waters Profits and appurtenances whatsoever is the said Land and Premises abovementioned belonging or in any wise appurtenanting and also the Reversion and Reversions Remainder and Remainders Rents and services of the said Premises and every Part thereof and all the Estate Right Title Interest Claim and Demand whatsoever of him the said George Irie of in and to the said Land and Premises and every part thereof to have and to hold the said one hundred acres of Land more or less to him the said Robert Hinnebrew his Heirs and assigns forever and all and singular the said Premises as is abovementioned and every part and parcel thereof with the appurtenances unto the said Robt. Hinnebrew his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of the said Robt. Hinnebrew his Heirs and assigns for ever In Witness whereof the said George Irie have hereunto set my hand and Affixed my Seal the Day and year first above written Signed Sealed and Delivered

Ellis & Mary his Wife for and Consideration of the sum of twenty five Pounds one Shilling & six Pence current Money of Virginia to them in hand paid at or before the signing and Delivery of these presents the receipt of which and themselves fully satisfied Contented and paid doth hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained and sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant bargain and sell alien and confirm unto the said William Andrews his heirs and assigns forever one certain Tract or parcel of Land lying and being in aforesaid County of Southampton on the North side of Nottoway River containing two hundred and seven Acres which said Tract or parcel of Land was formerly granted by Deeds from the Chief Men of Nottoway Indians to Robert Hill and then by other Deeds from the said Robert Hill to the said
