 paid by the s^d William Freeman j^r the Receipt whereof the s^d W^m Freeman this wife Elizth doth
 hereby Acknowledge hath granted Bargained and sold aliened Enfeoff and Confirm and by these
 Presents doth grant Bargain and sell alien Enfeoff and Confirm unto the said W^m Freeman j^r
 his Heirs and assigns forever one Certain Tract or Parcel of Land Lying and being in the County of
 Southampton asd on the North side of the Gabbin Branch Containing by Estimation one hundred
 and fifty acres be the same more or less the s^d Dividend of Land being part of a patent of Land
 granted to one Joseph Delk Bearing Date the Twentysixth Day of July one thousand seven hundred
 and forty six and Bounded as followeth to wit Beginning at a pine in the head of a meadow
 branch thence North forty Degrees West three hundred & twenty poles to a pine then South fifty
 five Degrees west one hundred & forty poles to a pine then South Twenty Degrees East one hundred
 & twenty eight poles to a pine then South thirty Degrees East twenty pole to a North all Trees
