 Down the Various Courses of the said Creek to the Mouth of a branch called Plowmans thence
 up the S^d Branch to the beginning the said Land containing by Estimation One Hundred Acres
 be the same more or less it being Part of a patent granted to Tho^s Johnson & by him conveyed to his
 Son Barnaby Johnson & made over by Barnaby to the S^d John Johnson made over by Deed Brought
 in Open Court the Grant to the S^d Tho^s Johnson being on the 24th Day of March Relation therunto
