& fifty five Between William Harding of the County of Southampton of the one Part
and Etheldred Taylor of the same Place of the other Part Witnesseth that the said
William Harding for and in Consideration of the Sum of twenty Pounds to him in Hand
paid by the said Etheldred Taylor at or before the sealing & Delivery of these Presents the
Test: whereof he doth hereby acknowledge and thereof acquit & discharge the said Eth. Taylor
his Heirs &c by these Presents the said William Harding hath granted Bargained sold
Aliened & confirmed and by these Presents doth grant Bargain sell Alien & confirm unto
the said Eth. Taylor & to his Heirs and assigns for ever all that the said William Harding
Plantation Tract or parcel of Land situate lying & being in the Parish of Nottoway &
County of Southampton aforesaid Containing two hundred & seventy five acres more or
less Granted to the said William Harding by Patent dated 1 November 1734 and bounded
as expressed in the said Patent And all Houses Outhouses Edifices Buildings Woods
Haies Waters Water Courses profits Commons duties Hereditaments & Appurtenances whatsoever
to the same belonging or in any wise appertaining And the Reversion and Reversion
Remainder & Remainders Rents Issues & profits and all the Estate Right Title and
Interest of him the said William Harding of in & to the same To have and to hold
the said Plantation Tract or parcel of Land & premises with the appurtenances unto the
said Eth. Taylor and to his Heirs & assigns To the only proper use and behoof of him

and his Heirs the said Plantation Tract or parcel of Land and premises with the
