 Testified by their being made Parties to these Presents in Consideration of the sum of One Hundred &
 Seventy three Pounds One shilling Current money of Virg^a to them in hand Paid the Receipt whereof is
 hereby Acknowledged have granted bargained & sold Alien enfranch^d released & Confirmed by these
 Presents do grant bargain & sell Alien enfranch^d release & Confirm unto the^r Howell Edmunds Junior
 his Heirs and Assigns for ever Three Tracts or Parcels of the Afores^d Land as above to be sold containing
 Nine Hundred & eighty two Acres ^{the} First Tract contains two Hundred & Ninety four Acres and
 bounded as followeth to wit, Beginning at a live Oak at Corner Tree in Blunts Swamp at the Mouth
 of the Deep Branch Thence up the Meanders of the^r Branch to a Corner Red Oak on Barrons
 Road Thence down the various Courses of the^r Road to a Pine standing on the Road side in the
 Head of Blunts Swamp Afores^d and Down the^r Swamp as it Meanders to the Beginning (The
 said Tract or Parcel of Land contains Three Hundred & Sixty Nine Acres) And bounded as follows
 Beginning at a live Oak in Blunts Swamp a Corner of N^o 7 running up the Meanders of the^r
