

This Indenture Tripartite made the Eleventh Day of January in the Thirtieth Year
 of the Reign of our sovereign Lord George the second by the Grace of God of Great Britain
 France & Ireland King Defender of Faith &c Between Sam Robert Scholar Shipwright
 John Turner and Thomas Step Chief Men of the Notoway Indian Nation of the first part
 Joseph Gray William Taylor & Howell Edmunds of the County of Southampton Gent of
 the second part and Joseph Warren J^r of the County of Southampton of the third part -
 Whereas by an Act of Assembly made in the twenty ninth Year of the Reign of his
 present Majesty intituled an Act to enable the Notoway Indians to sell certain Lands & for
 other Purposes therein Mentioned The Chief Men of the said Notoway Nation were empowered
 with the Consent & Approbation of the^d Joseph Gray William Taylor & Howell Edmunds
 The Survivor or Survivor of them (Trustees therein named to see the said Act duly executed
 to sell at Credit not Exceeding Twelve Months and Convey as well about three Hundred
 Acres of low grounds part of their Tract of Land of six Miles square lying between the
 Western Boundary of their^d Tract and Buckhorn Swamp on the south side of Notoway
 River in the^d County of Southampton as that Part of their^d Lands lying on the
 East side of the^d Swamp and the south side of Buckhorn Road to the eastern and
 Southern Boundary thereof containing about five Thous^d Acres for the best price that
 could be got and after any Agreement made for the sale of the same or any part thereof it
 by the^d Act Declared. Lawfull for the chief Men of the^d Nation together with the Trustees
 Afores^d or the Survivor or Survivor of them to Seal and Deliver any Deed or Deeds indented
 for the Conveyance of the fee simple and Inheritance of the said Lands to the Purchaser
 upon his entering into Bond with good Security for the Payment of the purchase Money
 to the said Trustees for the use and purpose in the said Act expressed & Whereas the said
 Joseph Warren for the Consideration of Seven Pounds six Shillings Current Money (for
 the Payment whereof to the said Trustees for the use Aforesaid he hath entered into bond
 with good Security) hath purchased two hundred and nine Acres part of the^d Tract of five
 Thousand Acres of Land of the said Chief Men of the said Indian Nation with the Consent and
 Approbation of the said Trustees Bounded as followeth to Wit Beginning at a Red Oak in
 the Indian Out line a Corner of Number Six running along the^d Line South forty five Degrees
 East three hundred and ninety two Poles to a live Oak in Buckhorn Swamp thence up the
 Meanders of the said Swamp the Mouth of the Deep Branch thence up the Meanders of the^d
 Deep Branch thence up the Meanders of the^d Deep Branch to a Red Oak standing on
 Barrons Road thence up the^d Road to the beginning now This Indenture will witness
 that the^d Chief Men of the^d Indian Nation with the Consent & Approbation of the said
 Trustees (Testified by their being made Parties to these presents) for & in Consideration of
 the^d Sum of Seven Pounds six Shilling Secured to be paid as Afores^d Have granted
 bargained
