This Indenture Tripartite made the Eleventh Day of January
 in the Thirtieth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord King George the 3^d in the
 Year of Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred & fifty seven Between Sam^l Rob^t
 Scholar Shipen Jack Will, John Turner & Tom Step Chief Men of the Nottoway Indian
 Nation of the first Part, Joseph Gray William Taylor & Howell Comundo of the County
 of Southampton Gent. of the second Part & Miles Cary the younger of the County of York
 Attorney at Law of the third Part **Whereas** by one Act of Assembly made in the
 twenty ninth Year of his Pres^t Majesty's Reign Intituled an Act to enable the Nottoway
 Indians to sell certain Lands & for other purposes therein mentioned It is among other things
 Enacted that the Chief Men of the Nottoway Nation be & they are hereby impowered to sell three
 Hundred Acres of Land therein mentioned by & with the Cons^t & Approbation of the J^{ts} Gray
 Wm Taylor & Howell Comundo to sell at a Credit not exceeding twelve Months & convey the
 same for the best price that could be got & after any Agreement made for the same or any part thereof
 it should & might be lawful for the Chief Men of the Nottoway Nation together with the Trustees to
 execute any Deed or Deeds indented for the conveyance of the Fee Simple & Inheritance of
 the Lands to the purchaser who should give bond & security for the payment purchase money
 to the Trustees and any Deed or Deed so executed & perfected & Acknowledged or proved &
 recorded according to the Directions of the Act should be sufficient to pass the Fee Simple
 Estate of the Lands so sold to the purchaser as by the in part recited Act of Assembly
 more fully is contained **Now this Indenture Witnesseth** that the J^{ts} Sam^l
 Rob^t Scholar Shipen Jack Will John Turner & Tom Step Chief Men of the Nottoway
 Nation & the J^{ts} Joseph Gray William Taylor & Howell Comundo for & in consideration of
 the sum of eleven Pounds to the J^{ts} Joseph Gray Wm Taylor & Howell Comundo in Hand
 paid

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
