This Indenture Inpartite made the Twelfth Day of Jan^y in the thirtieth
Year of the reign of our sovereign Lord George the 3^d by the Grace of God of Great Britain
France & Ireland King Defender of the Faith &c. & in the year of Lord Crocker one thousand
Seven hundred and fifty seven **BETWEEN** Saml Robin scholar Shipper Jack Will
John Turner & Tom step chief Men of the Nottoway Indian Nations of the first
Part Joseph Gray W^m Taylor & Howell Edmunds of the County of Southampton gent.
of the second Part and Elisha Crocker of the County of Southampton of the third part
whereas by an Act of Assembly made in the twenty ninth Year of the reign of his
present Majesty intituled An Act to enable the Nottoway Indians to sell certain Lands
and for other purposes therein mentioned The chief Men of the Nottoway Nation
were empowered with the Consent & Approbation of the said Joseph Gray William
Taylor & Howell Edmunds the survivors or survivor of them (Trustees therein named
to see the said Act duly executed) to sell at a Credit not exceeding twelve Months &
convey as well about three hundred Acres of low ground part of their said Tract of
Land of six Miles Square lying between the western Boundary of their said Tract
and Buckhorn Swamp on the south side of Nottoway River in the said County of
Southampton as that part of their said Land lying on the east side of the said Swamp
and the south side of Buckhorn Road to the Eastern & Southern Boundary thereof
containing about five thousand Acres for the best price that could be got & after any
Agreement made for the sale of the same or any part thereof it is by the said Act Declared
lawfull for the chief Men of the said Nation together with the Trustees aforesaid or the
survivors or survivor of them to seal & Deliver any Deed or Deeds indented for the conveyance
of the fee simple and Inheritance of the said Lands to the Purchaser upon his entering into
Bond with good security for the payment of the purchase Money to the said Trustees
for the use & purpose in the said Act expressed and whereas the said Elisha Crocker for the
Consideration of Fifty five Pounds eighteen shillings Curr^t Money (for the payment
whereof to the said Trustees for the use aforesaid he hath entered into Bond with good
Security) hath purchased three hundred & nineteen Acres part of the said Tract of five
thousand Acres of Land of the said Chief Men of the said Indian Nation with the Consent
and Approbation of the said Trustees Bounded as followeth to wit Beginning
at a pine a corner of N^o 1 on the West side of Buckhorn Swamp in the Edge of the long ground
at the Mouth of Long Branch running up the various Courses of the said Branch to a
