Acres of Land as above to be sold & also the Reversion & Reversions Remaind^{ers} & Remainders
rents & services thereof & also all the Estate Right Title Interest Property Claims & Demands
whatsoever of the said Nation & their posterity of in and to the same to ^{have} hold & to hold the
said three hundred & nineteen Acres of Land with the Appurtenances unto the said Elisha
Crocker his Heirs & assigns to the only proper use and behoof of the^s Elisha Crocker his
